Unnamed Stream Mendocino County Tributary to Schooner Gulch Twp. 12N R. 16W Sec. 29 Surveyed on foot by Kevin Rockwood on April 5, 1966

This unnamed tributary enters into Schooner Gulch approximately ½ mile from the mouth. It ranges from 2-6 feet wide (average - 4 feet), and 6 inches to 3 feet deep (average - 9 inches). The pools are 3-6 feet wide and 1-3 feet deep (pool 50%; riffles 50%). They are well sheltered by overhanging brush and logs and undercut banks.

The total length is approximately 2¼ miles, running through a V-shaped canyon covered chiefly with second growth redwood for almost the whole distance. The upstream limits however, are approximately 200 yards from the fork with Schooner Gulch. Here a five foot high boulder falls with the water, landing on and splashing over boulders at the bottom of the falls. Native trout have been reported to be above these falls.

Local residents stated that this stream is used as a spawning and hatchery area for anadromous fish (chiefly steelhead), but that very few have been seen in there in the last few years, ever since the large driftwood log jam has been at the mouth of Schooner Gulch.
