Name - Unnamed tributary to Petaluma Creek

County - Sonoma County

Stream Section - Surveyed from Lakeville Highway to ½ mile east of Old Lakeville Highway

Length - 1 mile

Tributary To - Petaluma Creek

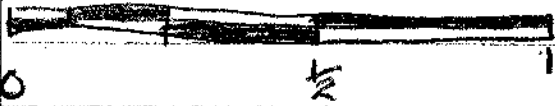
Other Names - Unknown

Location of Mouth - The stream has no visible confluence with a longer stream but sinks into the ground ¼ mile west of Lakeville Highway #37. TWP - 4N R - 6W Section - 27

Source of Data - Surveyed by Bruce Thomson and Jim Michaels, and conversation with landowner on July 10, 1968; by car with frequent stops for closer observation on foot.

Extent of Observation - The stream is located in a V-shaped valley among rolling hills, used primarily for cattle farming. Two large reservoirs, immediately upstream and downstream from the old Lakeville Highway, furnish water in the form of seepage to the stream. The stream was primarily dry except for this seepage at the time of this survey. Considerable silt was found along the streambed. The local landowner said he stocked the upper reservoir with trout, but that no spawning takes place. Aside from this, no fishery value was observed. No management policy is recommended.
